

## Assessment: Hand tools

### Learner instructions

This assessment is about using hand tools for a BCATS project.

You need to show you can:

- choose the best hand tools for different project tasks
- use hand tools safely and skilfully for project tasks
- care for hand tools after use.

Your teacher will observe you using hand tools. They will provide comments in this assessment resource as evidence to support their observations.

You will need to provide the following evidence to support this. Submit it using myBCITO or the process at your school/organisation.

Record of cleaning and checks you completed for the tools you used (based on the process at your school/organisation).



Photos that clearly show the hand tools you used for different project tasks, and the PPE you wore when you were using them (if needed).

Photos of your workplace and storage areas, clearly showing hand tools safely stored after use.

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The grade you are awarded will be based on your ability to select ideal hand tools for project tasks and use them safely and skilfully.

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## Worksheet: Identify hand tools

For this assessment activity, you need to identify ideal hand tools that you would use for BCATS project tasks. It is an open book activity.

Being able to choose the right tools is an important skill in the BCATS workplace.

In the table below:



- choose the best hand tool(s) for each of the tasks listed
- explain why you chose each tool.

An example answer has been given.

Project task	Tool(s)	Reason for choosing the tool(s)
Example: Checking the corners on a picture frame are square.	Try square	<i>This has a 90 degree corner for measuring square</i>
Measuring the length of a long piece of timber.		
Marking out where cuts will be made on timber.		
Making a precise cut on a piece of cedar timber.		
Checking out a housing joint on a shelf project.		
Securing project components that have been glued together.		
Attaching a hinge to a cupboard door.		
Preparing a timber desktop for staining.		
Applying stain to the sides of a jewellery box.		

## Use hand tools

You need to show you can do these things for your project without being prompted:

- Choose the best hand tools for your project tasks
- Choose and use appropriate PPE for the hand tools you chose
- Use the hand tools carefully and safely to complete project tasks.



Your teacher will observe you using hand tools throughout the project.

## Care for hand tools
