

Assessment schedule: Skill Standard 40561

Learners must complete concrete work, without being prompted, as a BCATS project to be awarded this skill standard. If they participate in a group to complete the project, learners must demonstrate an appropriate level of skill for all skill standard requirements.

Assessment decisions should only be made when the project is completed and sufficient evidence has been gathered.

The project brief should be provided to learners.

The schedule below shows the evidence required for assessment criteria in the skill standard, guidance for the teacher and judgement statement/s.

Note: teacher observations and comments made in the assessment resource serve as key evidence requirements for each skill standard. All guidance below is intended to support the teacher's observations/comments.

Learning outcome	Evidence required	Teacher guidance (to be used in accordance with commentary in the Programme Guidance document)	Judgement statement
Complete concrete work as a BCATS project.	A completed <i>Materials list</i> worksheet.	Each material required for the project, and the quantity, must be listed based on information in the project brief.	Evidence must meet the minimum of Achieved criteria as outlined in the Waihangā Ara Rau BCATS Programme Guidance document – SS 40561. Comments related to the award of higher grades must reflect commentary in the Programme Guidance.
	A completed <i>Project record</i> worksheet.	Project record should include all of the learner's project tasks, and quality checks at each stage should be identified, along with any changes made as a result. Feedback should only be noted if it was received for the project task, and if it was received, the resulting changes should also be noted.	
	Photos that clearly show the completed formwork before the concrete is placed.	Photos must clearly show the completed formwork prior to concrete placement to inform the assessment of the final concrete and any issues observed.	
	Photos that clearly show the finish on the completed project.	Photos must clearly show the finish on the completed project to enable assessment of the learner's skill across the range of project tasks.	
	Copy of the project brief.	The project brief is provided as a means of recognising the intended project and comparing it with the end product.
